Fifteen Months

At 15-months-old, babies will want to show you things by pointing!

Watch as your baby points to a balloon and looks at you to see your reaction.

Seven Months

Who's that other baby?
At seven months,
babies will be interested in
their own reflection.

Spend some time in front of mirrors and watch her learn!

Five Years

Five-year-olds are ready to write.

Show your child how to write his name and help him as he learns.

Five Years

Five-year-olds like to tell stories.

Start a story and ask your child, "What happens next?" to encourage her to tell you a story.

Four Years

Four-year-olds have big imaginations.

Enjoy as your child imagines scary monsters or pretends to be superhero!

Three Years

Three-year-olds like to imitate their parents.

Watch as your child mimics you sweeping the floor, talking on the phone or folding laundry!

Three Months

Cooing is an important milestone at three months.

Help your baby learn to speak by making the same sounds and talking back to him!

Two Years

Toddlers start to get chatty!

Two-year-olds can talk in two-word phrases such as "drink milk" or "play car!"

Two Years

Two-year-olds like to play with other children.

Encourage social development by taking your child to play groups.

One Year

At one year, babies will respond to the sound of their name.

Say your baby's name and watch him turn his head.

One Year

Saying "Uh Oh!" is an important milestone for babies at 12 months.

Say "Uh Oh!" when you drop something and watch your baby learn too!

Eighteen Months

Babies begin playing pretend at 18 months.

You can encourage your baby to play pretend by giving him a play phone to "talk" to grandma!

One Month

Babies begin to smile by one month.

Make silly faces while looking at your baby and watch your baby smile back!
